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Clarence Henke was awarded degrees in BS Geological Engineering (1958)

- MD - Medical Doctor (1963)
- MPH - Masters of Public Health (1964) from the University of Minnesota.

He completed medical post-graduate residencies in Preventive Medicine, Internal Medicine, Diagnostic Radiology and Fellowship in Nuclear Medicine with (ABMS) American Board Medical Specialty certification in Preventive Medicine (Public Health 1970, Occupational Medicine 1997);

Family Practice 1975-208; and Conjoint Boards of Internal Medicine, Pathology, Radiology & Nuclear Medicine 1980.

He served on active duty (Lt. Commander) with the USPHS, CDC as Epidemiologist for Region 8 (Western states from Canada to Mexico).

He was reassigned to the New York Staten Island USPHS hospital as Consultant in Immunization and Communicable disease and migrant Consultant. (1964-66)

He completed the 2-year Preventive Medicine residency (Communicable Diseases) with the Maryland State Health Department. (1966-68)

He was appointed State Epidemiologist for Maryland State and Director of Hospital licensing (1968).

He established and directed tuberculosis, venereal disease and immunization clinics for the migrant workers in Maryland State.

He received ABMS certification in Preventive Medicine- Public Health in 1970.

Returning to Minnesota, he served as Medical Director of the Rochester -Olmsted County Health Dept.; Minnesota State Region III, with active staff /teaching appointment at Mayo Clinic, Division of Epidemiology in Communicable Diseases and Epidemiology.

He had Army Reserve Commission as Lieutenant Colonel, Minnesota National Viking 47th Division, as General Preventive Medicine Officer and Officer in Charge of Field Hospital for summer and winter active-duty training of Guard members at Fort Ripley, Minnesota (1968 – 1979).

He was appointed Medical Director of the St. Paul City Health Dept and Director of the Occupational Medicine Residency Program, with Instructor appointment in Minnesota Medical School in Public Health and Communicable diseases.

He received ABMS certification In Family Practice in 1975 with 4 Recertifications until 2008.

He completed one year of Internal Medicine Residency at United Hospitals.

He completed the 2- year Nuclear Medicine Fellowship program at the Minneapolis VA hospitals (1977-1979).

He completed the Diagnostic Radiology residency program at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas (1979-80).

He received ABMS certification by the Conjoint Boards of Internal Medicine, Pathology, Diagnostic Radiology and the Society of Nuclear medicine in 1980.

He served 2 years active-duty as Director of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine at Reynolds Army Hospital as Lieutenant Colonel with promotion to Full Colonel (1980-82).

He returned to Colorado in 1984, practicing Diagnostic Radiology & Nuclear Medicine in Denver, Colorado Springs, La Junta, Lamar and Trinidad Hospitals and Occupational Medicine in Colorado Springs, Boulder, Denver and Pueblo clinics..

He was Medical Advisor to the Golden Cycle mining Corporation in Cripple Creek, Colorado, to develop a safe program for an ore-cyanide process and perform medical evaluation for work related injuries (1985-90).

He returned to Minnesota as Medical Director of the Allina Health Occupational Medicine program, covering all Minnesota State employees and as Medical Director of United Hospitals Occupational Health Clinic in St. Paul, Minnesota (1992-97).

He received American Board Medical Specialty certification in Preventive Medicine- Occupational Medicine in 1997.

He was Chief Medical Officer for the Minneapolis and St. Paul Police and Fire Departments and designed/supervised training programs for police officers and firefighters. He examined and treated injured police and firefighters and determined temporary or permanent impairment ratings for them (1993-97).

In 1998, he returned to Colorado Springs as Medical Director of Health South Clinics in Pueblo and Colorado Springs and Medical Director of an EmergiCare Clinic until 2000.

From July 2000 – Dec 2012, he practiced Occupational Medical and Diagnostic Radiology for the Rocky Mountain Medical Group clinics in Englewood and Aurora, Colorado.

He currently performs Independent Medical Evaluations for Disabled Veterans and Social Security Disability benefits for individuals.

He was Physician Consultant to Pinnacol Assurance for evaluation of work related injuries and performed Independent Medical Examinations of injured workers 1989-2004.

He has been the Contract Medical Advisor to FPPA (Fire and Police Pension Association) for the State of Colorado since 2010.

Dr. Henke has been a Colorado Division of Workers Compensation Level II Accredited Physician since 1994, with appointment to the Medical Review Panel for DIME.

He has active memberships in AMA, Colorado State Medical Society, Acad. of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, Acad. of Disability Evaluating Physicians and Fellow of American College of Physicians.

He was appointed to the American Board of Disability Analysts in 2010.

He was recognized by Cambridge WHOS-WHO as Expert in the field of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine in 2011. He was selected by Cambridge WHOS-WHO as the Cambridge Professional of the Year in Health Care for 2011.
